# BILLS ON THE GOVERNOR'S DESK

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- SB 1288 (Leyva, D-Chino) – Nurse Staffing Ratio Penalties:

# STATE BUDGET

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- ❑ 340B Drug Discount Policy – DHCS proposed language requested by the Legislature
  
- ❑ Proposition 56 GME Funds to UC – \$40 million additional dollars to UC
  
- ❑ Health Budget Trailer Bill
  - ❑ Council on Health Care Delivery Systems
  - ❑ Health Care Cost Transparency Database



# BILLS NOT ON THE GOVERNOR'S DESK

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- ❑ AB 3087 (Kalra, D-San Jose) – Rate Regulation, would have established a commission to set commercial reimbursement rates for providers

Held in Assembly Appropriations Committee

- ❑ SB 538 (Monning, D-Azusa) – Hospital Contracting, would have put hospitals at a significant competitive disadvantage when negotiating contracts with health plans

Held in Assembly Health Committee – not heard



# BILLS NOT ON THE GOVERNOR'S DESK (cont.)

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- ❑ AB 2874 (Thurmond, D-Richmond) – AG Permission to Reduce Services, would have required hospitals to obtain the attorney general's to close a facility or reduce services.

Failed passage – Assembly floor
